Dear Shipmate,

Our reunion committee has settled on September 24 thru 27 of 2015 as the dates for our next gathering. By now, you should have received a questionnaire from the committee asking for some information about you and your interest in some possible reunion events. Of the more than 220 shipmates we know of, only 45 have responded to the survey. The committee needs to know whether or not you are interested in attending. Saying "yes" does **not** commit you attending. The committee does need to get a better feel for how many "might" be coming in order to aid in their planning for activities and dinner venues. So please send in a survey response.

A second "portable" storage shed has been erected on the property behind the main museum building. The large snow blower has been relocated to this shed freeing up space in the built-in shed for grounds keeping equipment. Because of a lack of space and easy accessibility, some of this equipment was previously stored in the old 'new' shed holding museum sales items. COB Bower now has his and Glenda's Park gardening gear stowed all in one place.

Executive Director John Maier said Albacore Park will honor the USS Squalus and VADM. Momsen on Sept. 20 when it hosts Submarine History Day. Rising to the rank of Admiral, Momsen is credited as being the advocate and innovator of the modern submarine, best represented by Albacore, the centerpiece of the museum. Adm. Momsen's grand - daughter is planning to attend the event and will bring some family mementos to display. USSVI representatives from Marblehead and Thresher bases also will be present during the day and a " Tolling of The Boats" ceremony will be performed. John is working on getting a vendor to come to the Park and sell pre-made sub sandwiches and beverages.

John also related that Albacore Park is in negotiations with the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard to have a copy of a Momsen diving bell (the McCann Submarine Rescue Chamber) similar to the one used in the Squalus rescue, on permanent display at the Park.

Squalus is a fascinating story because of the rescue and salvage. Squalus was raised Sept. 13, 1939, and towed to the shipyard, where it was repaired and refitted. Squalus was decommissioned Nov. 15, 1939, renamed Sailfish on Feb. 9, 1940, and recommissioned May 15 of that year. Sailfish left Portsmouth in 1941 to patrol the Pacific and served during World War II. It was decommissioned Oct. 27, 1945 and its conning tower now stands as a memorial at the Shipyard.

Years of negotiations between the State of New Hampshire (Department of Transportation), the Federal Highway Administration and an alphabet soup of other government agencies and PSMA have concluded. The State wanted the land forward of Albacore's bow for a Route 1 By-Pass/Market Street connector road and for the approach to the replacement Sarah Mildred Long bridge. Both parties have signed an agreement of sale. A possible date for actual closing on the sale is 1 August. Under the agreement, the

State gets the land and PSMA gets a check for \$1.5 million. In addition, the State will be responsible for making improvements to and along the connector road - among which are: drainage upgrades, permanent traffic signals, lane markings, sidewalks and crosswalks on Market Street. Throughout this whole process, PSMA Board member Ken Herrick has been most persistent in protecting the Park's interests and has kept the State and Federal agencies honest. Bravo Zulu Ken.
